- 4) Everyone: follow us on social media (Facebook, Twitter, or Instagram) for fun ways to get involved, like repping your school colors on College Gear Day!




COLLEGE & CAREER DATA DIVE

■ Ever enrolled in college ■ Earn a 2- or 4-year degree




Although the Road Map Project region has made some improvements in college readiness, college enrollment numbers are not moving and completion rates remain low. In our region, 64 percent of students will enroll in college sometime before their mid-twenties, but less than a third of them will complete a degree or credential.
